BIOGRAPHICAL NOTES

1996: Played in two games in Hull at his first European Championship A-Pool. **1999:** Tied for team lead in runs batted in and posted second-best batting average (.350) at European Championship A-Pool in Italy ... Had a hit in every game and multi-hit games against Russia and Germany. **2000:**

Suffered crushing knee injury during US try-out series, which forced him to miss 2001 European Championship A-Pool in Germany. **2002:** Starting shortstop for Great Britain in series against Sweden in Great Britain. **2003:** Came through with hits against Italy, Spain, Belgium, and Croatia at European Championship A-Pool in The Netherlands ... Second on team in runs batted in (four) ... Stole bases against Italy and Belgium ... Registered two hits against Cypress College in opening game of 2nd US try-out series in California ... Started all four games of series at shortstop. **2005:** Contributed base hits against Sweden, Germany, and Croatia at European Championship A-Pool in the Czech Republic ... Tied for second on team in runs (5) ... Led team in stolen bases (three) at Prague Baseball Week. **2006:** Connected for two hits, stole a base, and drove in a run against Regensburg Legionäre (game two) during Germany tour ... Hit by pitch three times in second game against the Tübingen Hawks ... Hit a single against the Bundesliga All-Stars in final game of tour ... As lead-off hitter, stole three bases and scored 2 runs in game two and tallied a hit in game three of series against Ireland in London. **2007:** Connected for two hits against the Yorkshire Knights, a British touring team, at Eifel Cup in Zülpich, Germany ... Provided two hits and two stolen bases in the opening game against Johns Hopkins University in GB series in London ... Drove in game-winning run with an infield single in pivotal game against France at European Championship A-Pool in Spain. **2008:** Led team in runs scored (4) at Four Nations Tournament in Belgium ... Delivered two hits and scored 3 runs against Belgian International All-Stars ... Had a single against Quebec. **2009:** Collected three hits, including a double against Spain, at the World Cup in Europe.
