Played professionally in the New York Yankees organization (1999-2001), for the Saarlouis Hornets of Germany's top league (2006), and also for the Calgary Vipers (Alberta) in the independent Northern League ... Played for the Australian team at the World Youth Championship in Taiwan in 1997, winning a bronze medal, and also played for the Queensland Rams and Windsor Royals in Australia ... Later served as Head Coach of the Windsor Royals

BIOGRAPHICAL NOTES

2006: Hit .500 to lead team in batting average during Germany tour ... Delivered a pinch-hit double in first game and then smacked three hits including a double and drove in 2 runs in second game against Regensburg Legionäre ... Chipped in a pair of hits in second game against the Tübingen Hawks. **2007:** Went 2-for-2 with 2 runs and a run batted in against Russia at European Championship A-Pool in Spain. **2010:** Started all five group games at European Championship A-Pool in Germany, in which he served as player-coach ... Broke up shut-out with Great Britain's only run against Sweden ... Suffered irritated nerve in arm on throw to second as catcher against Italy and was moved to designated hitting role for next game, but returned behind the plate against Greece.
