

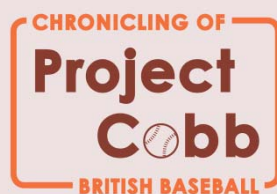

Total Membership for 1985 was 49,355. This was a decrease of 25,365 from the 1984 figure; most of the decrease took place in Italy which reported a fall of 24,182.

The European Cup 1985 broke new ground by having three separate pools organised.

NORTHERN BASEBALL & SOFTBALL ASSOCIATION

This Association is in its second year of existence. In 1985 there were five teams actively participating in baseball in this region, four of them were involved in competition in 1985, and the league placings are given below.

1. Blackadders(Whitley Bay). 2. Hexham Hellcats. 3. Wearside Hornets(Washington). 4. Chargers(North Shields).

Many of the games were played at Wallsend Sports Centre; but teams are anxious to lay-out baseball diamonds in their own localities. Baseball was played in the area in the distant past - the 1890's, and briefly at semi-pro level in 1938. As far as most people are concerned its present position dates back to 1984 when it began to gain in popularity thanks to local enthusiasts, who were helped by the national governing body of the sport(the BABSF) British Amateur Baseball & Softball Federation. An exhibition match was staged in Gateshead and as a result the Northern Baseball & Softball Association came into being.

Indoor coaching sessions were held at the start of 1985 at Killingworth Sports Centre which proved very popular and attracted a lot of new players to the sport. Coaches from Hull were supplied by the BBSF for many of the sessions and helped give the players knowledge of the sport which could then be carried forward to the outdoor season.

Our first competitive season was dominated by the Whitley Bay Blackadders which went through the season without a single defeat, but all the teams helped to ensure that we had a successful season, and we saw several close games.

What does the future hold for the sport in this area? The short term future seems bright with the promise of competition with other areas and the formation of a Northern All-Star team. It is by continually striving to improve and attracting younger players to the sport that baseball's future will be assured in this area. Several schools play softball, and the Northern Association will be working to increase the numbers playing in our area. Softball has the beauty of allowing younger children to become interested and attracts more people to both sports.

Passe-partouts valid for all games at Haarlem and valid in the other cities cost 150 D.Fl. for adults and 75 D. Fl. for youths of 14 years and younger.

Passe-partouts for the other cities are only valid for the city for which they are issued, and cost 90 D.Fl. for adults and 45 D.Fl. for youths.

The four cities have spent considerable sums on improving the baseball stadiums to be used for the series.

WELSH BASEBALL UNION

At the beginning of 1985 the administrations of the Welsh Baseball Union and The Welsh National Baseball League were merged. A continuing problem was the industrial action by the teaching unions, about 250 school teams are affiliated to the W.B.U., but schools baseball has ground to a standstill during 1984/1985; with the exception of about seven junior schools whose heads were sufficiently supportive and co-operative to permit games to be played completely during the school day.

To overcome this problem the W.B.U. are hoping that Scout and Guide troops will operate baseball teams.

Highlights of 1985. Llanrumney Y.C. won the Premier Division Championship for the twelfth successive season. Llanrumney Y.C. also won a hard fought final of the W.B.U. Cup versus Caerau, the largest W.B.U. Final crowd for some years turned out in the hope of seeing a win by the underdog Caerau team, which had gained a victory over Llanrumney a couple of weeks earlier.
