

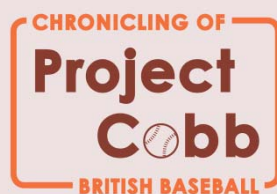

## MIDLANDS

Our Pony League was comprised of only three teams, Nottingham Pirates, Southglade Kestrels and Bestwood Braves. Kestrels proved to be much the strongest team and as well as winning the League they took the Jimmy Goins Tournament, Jason Ball (Southglade Kestrels) winning the M.V.P. Award. Bestwood Braves did very well in their first season, coming close to beating Pirates on one occasion and also managing to give Kestrels a bit of a scare.

Nottingham All-Stars travelled to Humberside and picked up the Eagle Invitation Trophy for the third successive year, beating Humberside 13 - 3. Stephen Sewell (Southglade Kestrels) took the Player of the Day award.

Nottingham won the Colt County Championship for the third year in a row when they beat Humberside 11 - 6 at Southglade Park. Matthew Gaunt (Nottingham Pirates) was awarded the Player of the Day Trophy.

The Pony County Championships were played in Hull. Humberside beating Nottingham 14 - 3. Nicky Weaver (Southglade Kestrels) pick-ing up the award for the Most Valuable Player.

The Senior League is still in progress with Nottingham Pirates at the top followed by Southglade Hornets, Arnold Astros, Newark Giants and Horncastle Panthers. There are one or two games left to play with everything probably hinging on the game between Pirates and Southglade Hornets to be played on the 7th. September. If Pirates can grab this one they take the League: if not, a play-off will be necessary, Pirates having beaten Hornets 4 - 3 early in the season, both teams having won all their other games.

Southglade Hornets won the Nottingham Cup with a 23 - 13 victory in the Final at the Harvey Hadden Stadium.

Radio Trent Knights entered the new National League. There were one or two "Hiccups" but, with some effort from all involved, this League could be a success. Knights record was not too good - one win and three losses.

The British K.O. Cup Final was played at the Harvey Hadden Stadium in Nottingham. Southglade Hornets beating Nottingham Pirates 15 - 8.

## CHINESE PEOPLE'S REPUBLIC

In early 1985, the national team participated for the first time in the Asian Baseball Championship series. A national junior tournament was held in the summer of 1985, and a Chinese 12 and under team finished second in the third world Junior Rubber Baseball Championships in Japan. People's Republic amateur officials organised two training camps for junior players last winter.

Among foreign coaches visiting China to train Chinese teams was Bill Arce of the United States.

## FRANCE

PUC(Paris University Club) won the tournament for the European Cup 'B' Pool. This was played in Paris from 5th. to 8th. June. PUC thus qualified to enter the 'A' Pool. PUC claim that by winning the gold in the tournament, French baseball had achieved its first ever gold medal. Teams taking part, in addition to PUC, were Jezica Ljubljana (Yugoslavia), Cologne Dodgers(West Germany),Kovo Prague(Czechoslovakia), Espoo(Finland).

Since winning its first French title in 1970, PUC has sought to raise its standard of play by entering many tournaments in such places as Italy, Sweden and Quebec.

I note that the French Federation has 64 clubs in membership; some of these clubs, such as PUC for example operate several teams, so the total of teams and players is quite impressive.

Ron Marshall, National Coach of the BBSF, kindly gave me brief details of the recent European Championship Tournament, 'B' Pool, staged in Paris, from 1st. to 6th. July. Five countries competed, and ended in the following order. 1. West Germany : 2. France : 3. Great Britain : 4. Finland : 5. Switzerland.

Ron described the field as a soccer pitch sited inside an athletics track. A pitcher's mound had been constructed. The right field line ran across the width of the field; and in right field the track had been covered temporarily with green matting.

He stated that attendances had run from 500 upwards, and surprised me by mentioning an attendance of 7,000 at the France v. West Germany game.

Burtonwood Braves won the North west title this season.

Youth baseball suffered considerably this year, mainly due to last years youngsters reaching the age of senior baseball, and with insufficient numbers to take their places, only two teams survived. There are however, new teams in formation, and we look forward to season '87 with much optimism

Total attendance at the 66 games was 217,550. The 24 games at Haar-

The overall average gate was 3,296 spectators; but the average varied, 5,208 at Haarlem to 1,821 at Eindhoven.

The last game of the series was that in which Taiwan beat Cuba 4 -3; the Taiwanese at the end of the game broke down in grief as they heard that the President of their baseball federation had just died.

## WELSH BASEBALL UNION

Wales played England in the 61st. international match(British code) on 19th. July. Wales won - the record now stands Wales 43 wins; England 17; with one game abandoned.

For Wales, John Smith(Llanrumney Y.C.) set a new record for caps, reaching 13. The previous record of 12, which he equalled in 1985, had stood since 1938; and was held by the late Tommy Denning, who spent his peak years playing for Splott U.S.

England has a smaller player pool to call on - so several English players have obtained more than 13 caps. Bobby Davin(Anfield O.B.) set up a new record of caps for England with 22 in this game.

Ivor Beynon, President of the Welsh Baseball Union, died earlier in the year; the game programme contained an interesting recollection of Ivor, written by Bill Barrett, press correspondent for the South Glamorgan Schools Baseball League.

Bill Barrett also had an item headed Schoolboy/Schoolgirl Baseball included in the programme. I was interested to read that a small schoolboys league had been formed in Luton. Enquiries had also been received from Grimsby and East London.

Ladies baseball is also flourishing in the Cardiff & Newport area. This league was originally formed in 1923, but faded out in the 1960's. However the league was revived in 1973 with 6 teams and has steadily grown. There are now more than 30 teams operating in 4 divisions.

The present secretary of the Ladies Baseball league is Howard Evans, who for some years has acted as publicity officer for the Welsh National Baseball League.

The Welsh League title(mens) was won for the 13th. consecutive time by Llanrumney Y.C.; this team also won the W.B.U. Cup. The other major knock-out cup - the Welsh Brewers Cup - was won by a newcomer to the ranks of trophy winners. St. Michaels Old Boys (Newport) caused an upset by beating the most powerful Gwent team, Alexandra Old Boys.
